RECYCLE YOUR CHRISTMAS TREE

We've been made aware of a tree recycling project that raises funds for St. Anne's Hospice. If you follow this link, you can find out more about the scheme, register to have your tree collected and make a small donation:

The charity has traditionally collected Xmas trees in the Bramhall, Cheadle Hulme & Woodford areas but has expanded to Didsbury this year due to a link with Didsbury Cricket Club. As the site works on a postcode basis, M20 addresses are eligible for collection.

Once you have registered, your Christmas tree will be collected on **Sat 7 Jan** by the charity volunteers. The trees are then put through a chipper at Bramhall Cricket Club and taken for use at a local farm.

Last year the scheme raised £8500 for St Ann's Hospice & they are hoping to raise in excess of £10,000 this year.
