#### 1. Key staff working with your child

PPA time will be covered by Rob King, Kathleen Repper-Day and Maz Flitcroft. From November onwards, Mr Griffiths will work with some groups a couple of times a week for “booster lessons” to enable children to be taught in smaller classes in preparation for high school. Miss Hanly is the Year 6 SENCO, Mr Moule is Assessment Co-ordinator and Mrs Day is Assistant Head for UKS2.

#### 2. Class Routines

Children will make their own way into the Rhodes Building when the doors open at 08:45 a.m. We are aware that some children at this age start to come to school with phones, keys and other valuables from time to time. We ask that these are all handed over to the staff member on door duty first thing in the morning so they can be stored securely during the day. At the end of the day, the children will exit via the same main doors. We are aware that in Year 6, some children are starting to make their own way to and from school. We discuss this with the children at the start of the year and ask them to let an adult know during the day if there are changes to their normal routine.

Timetabled PE will be on Tuesdays and Fridays but there may be lunchtime or after school clubs on other days, requiring PE kit and we would expect your child to be aware of these and have the appropriate clothing.

Class homework is usually given out on a Friday, although there may also be additional booster homework. Every half term, we usually also give the children project-based topic homework. We run a homework club on a Monday lunchtime and a lunchtime detention once a week for children who have not completed their homework. We do expect children to complete homework to the best of their ability and on time as part of their preparation for high school. If you feel that homework causes your child regular problems, please make an appointment with Miss Hanly, as SENCO, to discuss how we can best support you and your child with this.

Our library slot is on a Friday.
