Since September 2022 we have both taken on the new role of Inclusion Lead at Cavendish. It is our job to oversee the provision for all children, including those with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities, so that pupils feel confident and achieve their full potential. We support all staff and families to ensure pupils have access to a broad and balanced curriculum appropriate to their needs, as well as seeking advice from external agencies (e.g. Speech and Language Therapists, Educational Psychologists) when necessary.

We are passionate about supporting all children to reach their potential and thrive. We are looking forward to continuing to grow as an inclusion team and to further develop provision at our brilliant school.

Sarah Hookes is the SENDCO for EYFS/KS1/ LKS2

I have worked at Cavendish for 16 years and have been a SENDCo for around 11 years. I have predominantly taught in Key Stage 1 but I currently work out of the classroom leading the provision for children with additional needs from Nursery to year 4. It is a joy to be in a role which enables me to spend time with so many different children, families and staff across school and see daily how wonderful this community is.



Roisin Carroll is the SENDCO for UKS2

I have worked at Cavendish for 14 years and have been a SENDCo for 10 years. I have spent most of my time teaching in year 6 and have class responsibility for 6RC. I am also the SENDCo for children in year 5 and 6. I love working with the older children, seeing how much they have grown during their time at Cavendish and supporting them and their families ready for the next stage of their educational journey.
